Reading

KS2 progress [Guidance](#)

- Key stage 2 progress in reading (-4.1) was significantly **below** national and in the **lowest** 20% of all schools in 2019 as well as in 2018 and 2017.

Attainment (all key stages) [Guidance](#)

- Key stage 2 attainment of the expected standard (100+) in reading (50%) was significantly **below** national and in the **lowest** 20% of all schools in 2019 as well as in 2018 and 2017. Of the 56 pupils in 2019, 28 did not meet the expected standard, with an average scaled score of 91. Key stage 2 attainment of the high standard (110+) in reading (9%) was significantly **below** national and in the **lowest** 20% of all schools in 2019 as well as in 2018 and 2017.
- The three-year average reading attainment score (99.2) was in the **lowest** 20%.
- Sentences for key stage 1 reading attainment of the expected standard and greater depth have not been triggered because the criteria have not been met.
- In 2019, the proportion of pupils who met the expected standard (32+) in phonics in Year 1 (68%) was significantly **below** national and in the **lowest** 20% of all schools. Of the 59 pupils, 19 did not meet the expected standard, with an average mark of 12.
- Early years foundation stage attainment of the expected standard in the reading early learning goal (65%) was significantly **below** national and in the **lowest** 20% of all schools in 2019 as well as in 2018 and 2017.

Writing

KS2 progress [Guidance](#)

- Key stage 2 progress in writing (-2.5) was significantly **below** national and in the **lowest** 20% of all schools in 2019 as well as in 2018 and 2017.

Attainment (all key stages) Guidance

- Key stage 2 attainment of the expected standard in writing (61%) was significantly **below** national and in the **lowest** 20% of all schools in 2019 as well as in 2018 and 2017. Key stage 2 attainment of greater depth in writing (9%) was significantly **below** national and in the **lowest** 20% of all schools in 2019 as well as in 2018 and 2017.
- Sentences for key stage 1 writing attainment of the expected standard and greater depth have not been triggered because the criteria have not been met.
- A sentence for early years foundation stage attainment of the expected standard in the writing early learning goal in 2019 has not been triggered because the criteria have not been met.

Mathematics

KS2 progress Guidance

- Key stage 2 progress in mathematics (-5.0) was significantly **below** national and in the **lowest** 20% of all schools in 2019.
- Mathematics progress has **declined** between 2018 and 2019.

Attainment (all key stages) Guidance

- Key stage 2 attainment of the expected standard (100+) in mathematics (48%) was significantly **below** national and in the **lowest** 20% of all schools in 2019. Of the 56 pupils, 29 did not meet the expected standard. Of these, 28 pupils had a score, with an average scaled score of 92. Key stage 2 attainment of the high standard (110+) in mathematics (4%) was significantly **below** national and in the **lowest** 20% of all schools in 2019.
- The three-year average mathematics attainment score (100.4) was in the **lowest** 20%.
- Sentences for key stage 1 mathematics attainment of the expected standard and greater depth have not been triggered because the criteria have not been met.
- Early years foundation stage attainment of the expected standard in the mathematics early learning goal (67%) was significantly **below** national and in the **lowest** 20% of all schools in 2019 as well as in 2018 and 2017.

Other measures in 2019 Guidance

- In 2019, 39% of pupils achieved the key stage 2 expected standard in reading, writing and mathematics, significantly **below** national and in the **lowest** 20% of all schools. A sentence for the percentage of pupils in 2019 achieving the key stage 2 high standard in reading, writing and mathematics has not been triggered because the criteria have not been met.
- In 2019, 61% of pupils achieved the expected standard (100+) in the key stage 2 English grammar, punctuation and spelling test, significantly **below** national and in the **lowest** 20% of all schools. In 2019, 14% of pupils achieved the high standard (110+) in the key stage 2 English grammar, punctuation and spelling test, significantly **below** national and in the **lowest** 20% of all schools.
- A sentence for the percentage of pupils achieving the key stage 2 science expected standard has not been triggered because the criteria have not been met.
- A sentence for the percentage achieving a good level of development in the early years foundation stage in 2019 has not been triggered because the criteria have not been met.

Absence (whole school) [Guidance](#)

- Overall absence (5.1%) was in the **highest** 20% of all schools in 2019 as well as in 2018 and 2017.
- Persistent absence (15.5%) was in the **highest** 20% of all schools in 2019.
- The rate of persistent absence (15.5%) in 2018/19 was in the **highest** 20% of schools with a similar level of deprivation. An equivalent sentence for overall absence has not been triggered because the criteria have not been met.

Exclusions (whole school) [Guidance](#)

- The rate of total fixed period exclusions (2.43%) was in the **highest** 20% in 2017/18.
- The rate of repeat fixed period exclusions (1.55%) was in the **highest** 20% in 2017/18.
- Of the 11 pupils with at least one fixed period exclusion in 2017/18, 64% were excluded on more than one occasion and none received 10 or more fixed period exclusions during the year.
- Of the 24 fixed period exclusions in 2017/18, 12 were for **persistent disruptive behaviour**. Other reasons which accounted for more than 10% of fixed period exclusions in 2017/18 were: verbal abuse/threatening behaviour against an adult (4); damage (6).
- There were no permanent exclusions in 2017/18. The national average for this year was close to zero. There were no permanent exclusions in the previous two years either.

Pupil groups [Guidance](#)

Sentences related to the performance of pupil groups will only appear for the pupil groups disadvantaged and low/middle/high prior attainers. Absence sentences are generated for FSM, SEND and EAL. They will be displayed where the group differs to that of the whole school. Exclusions, phonics and EYFS pupil groups will not appear in this section.

- For low prior attainers, Key stage 1 attainment of the expected standard in writing (44%) was significantly **above** national in 2019.
- For disadvantaged pupils, Key stage 1 attainment of the expected standard in reading (56%) was significantly **below** national in 2019. Key stage 1 attainment of the expected standard in mathematics (59%) was significantly **below** national in 2019.

MAT/LA level information Guidance

School workforce Guidance

According to the November 2018 school workforce census:

- in 2017/18, 70.4% of teachers had at least one period of sickness absence compared with a national average of 54%.
- in 2017/18, 10.5 days on average were lost to teacher sickness absence compared with a national average of 4.0.
- at the time of the census, there was 1 full-time vacant teacher post in the school.

Ethnicity Guidance

- This school has 14 out of 17 possible ethnic groups. Those with 5% or more are:
 - 74%: White - British
 - 9%: Black or Black British - African

Local area Guidance

- The school location deprivation indicator was in quintile 5 (most deprived) of all schools.

- In 2018/19, the school had a revenue reserve of £-18,154.
- In 2018/19, this school had a negative in-year balance (£-248,041), the second year in a row in which expenditure has exceeded income.
- In 2018/19, this school had a per pupil spend of £6,556, an increase of £154 per pupil from the previous year.
- In 2018/19, this school received £2,465,148 in grant funding, £1,171,697 more than the national average.
