

STARTING SECONDARY SCHOOL SEPTEMBER 2024 NATIONAL OFFER DAY FRIDAY 1ST MARCH 2024

Accepting your offer

You need to accept your offer with the school directly. You must accept the offer by the deadline given in the offer email or letter. Otherwise, it may be withdrawn and the place given to someone else.

You should accept your offer even if you decide to join a waiting list or appeal (this will not affect either process).

Waiting lists

We have <u>automatically</u> added your child to the waiting list for higher school preferences that were refused. Please note:

- Waiting lists follow the school's admissions policy and are not based on the date the child is added to the list.
- If a space becomes free and your child qualifies for it, we will allocate it
 without asking you. At the same time, we will withdraw any earlier place
 offered, even if accepted, and give this to another child.
- You need to remove your child from the waiting list if you are happy with your place offered and do not want it to change. To do this complete our enquiry form, choose starting secondary school in September and in the notes box tell us you want to remove your child from all waiting lists. The deadline is 15 March.
- Waiting lists must be open until at least 31 December, and some schools keep them open all academic year.
- If the school is outside Leeds, you must check with the school whether you need to take any other steps to be on their waiting list.
- Accepting an offer with the school does **not** remove your child from the waiting list
 of your higher preferences. You need to complete the enquiry form.

Appealing: You have the right to appeal to an independent panel for any school that shows as **Preference refused**. An appeal must be set out in writing, giving your grounds for appeal. Find out more at www.leeds.gov.uk/offerday.

Appeals submitted by **28 March** will be heard before the summer holidays. You can appeal after this deadline, but your appeal may not be heard before school starts in September.

Before you appeal you should:

- Accept the place that you have been offered in case your appeal is not successful.
- Think about why you are appealing and <u>check if it's likely to be successful</u> as there are limited circumstances when an appeal can be granted.
- Read the <u>advice for appealing school places on GOV.UK</u> to understand the appeal process.

To amend your application due to a change in circumstances: To add new school preferences to your application, follow the instructions at www.leeds.gov.uk/offerday. You can find information about Leeds schools that have spaces or short waiting lists on this website. These schools are more likely to be able to offer a place to your child.

If you have moved address since you applied, you will need to send us change of address documents. Find out what documents we accept at <u>Making changes to your application</u> (leeds.gov.uk).
