Early Learning Goals

Throughout the summer term we will begin collecting evidence to assess children against the Early Learning Goals. Children will be assessed in 17 areas of the curriculum. A copy of the Early Learning Goals should be sent with this Newsletter as there are lots of ways you can help your child at home, especially in relation to the following criteria: Manage their own basic hygiene and personal needs, including dressing, going to the toilet and understanding the importance of healthy food choices. Use a range of small tools, including scissors, paintbrushes and **cutlery**.
