



For the financial year 2023 – 24, Hunslet Carr will receive £19270 in Sport Premium. The planned expenditure for this funding allocation is as follows:

Service Level Agreement with Active Schools-£1,000

The school will continue to sign up to the Active Schools service level agreement. It will allow us to continue to access professional advice and support to further develop the provision we provide for Physical Education, school sport and physical activity. The SLA allows us to access CPD and a wide range of school sport competitions and events.

Service Level Agreement with TSLA - £1,000

The school is wanting to improve links with the local high school and schools in the local cluster. Therefore, we are planning to sign up to a SLA created by The South Leeds Academy, where schools within the cluster can compete in more competitions and have access to a wider range of sports taster days.

Teaching Resources - £1,800

We will continue to update teaching resources to support the effective teaching of Physical Education. We will be purchasing a scheme of work for gymnastics this year therefore we will purchase relevant resources to ensure that lessons can be delivered to a high quality. We have also identified that we need to replace the gymnastics mats in order to ensure that they meet the correct health and safety standards.





Lunch time Coaching - £8,500

After the sustained success of employing a gymnastics coach, we will be continuing to use the funding to pay for specialist after school gymnastics clubs. Clubs continue to be fully subscribed and the children have received bronze and gold medals in city wide competitions. The clubs will be offered to children in all year groups, of all abilities.

Kit - £200

To continue to promote the importance of PE kit, we will be purchasing polo shirts for members of staff new to the school to ensure that they are modelling correct kit in PE lessons.

CPD - £1,300

We will be purchasing and implementing a new scheme of work for gymnastics called Real Gym, which complements the current scheme of work we are using in other areas of PE. The subject leader attended two day training to decide whether it would complement and develop gymnastics teaching. As with Real PE, we decided that Real Gym would be the best possible tool to ensure high quality, sustainable gymnastics lessons that will develop individual children as a whole.

All staff will receive a full day training session to improve confidence and competence in teaching gymnastics.

Any members of staff still requiring training will attend additional CPD days.

We have decided to build on our success within PE lessons and extend our physical activity message to parents. As a result, we have invested in a Family Funs scheme and resources, where parents attend workshops each week, looking at how they can increase physical activity for the family throughout the week.





Staff - £500

To ensure that children are able to access a wide range of competitive sporting events after school, we will employ a member of staff to drive to all events.

After school Clubs - £2500

To ensure that children have access to a wide range of sporting opportunities we will employ specialist coaches for after school club provisions.

Equipment - £1000

New equipment will need to be purchased to replenish stocks and to complement the new scheme of work to allow lessons to run effectively.
